
# General Travel Suggestions

# **Reciprocal Partners | Bylaws Changes**

Background

Purpose & Benefits for BHL

**Purpose.** Reciprocal Partnerships will allow BHL to participate more fully in the greater biodiversity community without additional costs of partnership for either party.

**Revenue impact.** There will be no loss of revenue for BHL as an outcome of this proposal. Suggested partners are already no cost (e.g. GBIF) or would have an off-setting cost for BHL to join (e.g. CETAF).

**Administrative impact.** There will be minimal administrative impact; maintaining communications, participation in mailing lists, etc. will not be burdensome for Secretariat staff.

**Time/Cost commitment.** Participating in these organizations to receive full benefit of the partnership will have a specific time impact on the Executive Committee, Program Director, and Program Manager. Likewise, depending on the level of participation, there will be financial costs associated with participation with these organizations.

**Other impacts.** Organizations that participate in this arrangement are neither content nor service providers. As such, they should have no impact on collections, technical development, etc. It is expected that Reciprocal Partners will provide input and guidance, but no requirements on BHL technical development.

**Benefits.** Expected direct benefits will be promotion of the BHL with other partners in these organizations; raising the profile of BHL in the biodiversity community; establishing contacts for joint fundraising; and etc. This is already evidenced in the BHL participation in GBIF.

**Participation in BHL.** Reciprocal partners would be invited to appropriate portions of the BHL Annual (or other) meetings as non-voting observers. BHL would expect reciprocal treatment from the partners.

**Nomenclature.** For the purpose of this document, the term "Reciprocal Partner" is being used as a placeholder. BHL would expect to use the appropriate terminology of the participating reciprocal partner in reference to the BHL's participation in that organization.



Example Partners

- CETAF. CETAF charges a membership fee. In discussions with the CETAF chair, it was proposed that a reciprocal arrangement between BHL and CETAF would be mutually beneficial;
- GBIF. BHL is already an associate of GBIF; this would formalize the relationship and allow GBIF to participate in BHL in a more formal manner (if they wish);
- EOL. EOL and BHL have a special relationship. This could remain as is, or EOL and BHL could more formally participate in this manner;
- Catalogue of Life Plus. BHL already supports CoL+ through attendance at meetings. This would formalize the arrangement and allow CoL+ to participate in BHL
- ICSTI. BHL participates as a non-paying partner of ICSTI;
- TDWG. Would not be covered by this arrangement. BHL is a paid institutional partner of TDWG; unless TDWG waived this fee, it would not be covered by this structure.

# Bylaws Ramifications

The following portions of the Bylaws would need amending or changing:

# ARTICLE III

<u>Section 2. Composition.</u> The Council is composed of one representative, generally, but not exclusively, the chief librarian, from each BHL Partner institution. Each representative has one vote on the Council. The BHL Program Director and all BHL committee chairs shall serve as ex-officio members of the Council. The Encyclopedia of Life (EOL) may also select an ex officio representative.

<u>Section 4. BHL Membership</u>. Membership criteria and approval procedures, as well as ancillary categories of BHL partnerships are outlined in Appendix II: Joining the Biodiversity Heritage Library. *[Appendix II would need a class of partnership that covers Reciprocal Partners added. Additionally, the language under Affiliate would need to be revised to parse the partnership class. Specific additions:* 

- Joining as a BHL Reciprocal Partner
- BHL Reciprocal Partner Responsibilities]

#### Proposed Process

As per Article III. Section 3. Duties and Responsibilities, the Members' Council determines the BHL partnership. Adding this category would require approval of the Members.

Recommendations of Executive Committee:

- Draft document for RP
- Propose draft Bylaws change
- BHL EC reviews and revises this document;
- Proposal is put in the form of a motion for the Members to discuss on the 14 December call; vote on the motion is called;
- Going forward, language should allow for the BHL EC to approve Reciprocal Partners without the approval of the Members



Draft Language for Appendix II

#### Joining as a BHL Reciprocal Partner

BHL Reciprocal Partners are those institutions or organizations that wish to reciprocally participate in the BHL in an collaborative or advisory capacity. These will typically be national or international biodiversity organizations, and discipline specific organizations. It does not include library consortia, publishers, or other potential providers of BHL content or services.

The BHL Chair and/or Program Director will sign, upon legal review, any formal letter of participation or memorandum of understanding to formalize the reciprocal partnership. The BHL Executive Committee will appoint appropriate representation to the Reciprocal Partner organization from either the Secretariat or Members Council.

Costs of attending meetings or other events are the responsibility of the Reciprocal Partner unless specifically approved by the BHL Executive Committee.

Institutions or organization who request BHL services or require technical assistance may be required to sign either an MOU or customized agreement that defines their level of participation and may incur service fees. The Reciprocal Partnership term will be reviewed annually and may be terminated by either BHL or the Reciprocal Partner with due notice.

#### BHL Reciprocal Partner Responsibilities

• Reciprocal partners will promote BHL to raise awareness with their partners. They will include BHL representatives as observers in their meetings. Joint fundraising possibilities will be explored and shared.

#### Joining as a BHL Affiliate BHL

Affiliates are those institutions or organizations that wish to participate in the BHL but are unable to pay the full annual dues or come from another part of the biodiversity community with related interests in the work of the BHL. Examples of affiliates are institutions that can contribute content, technical or other in-kind services; publishers for whom BHL is hosting content; and biodiversity organizations with allied interests that provide continuing support for the BHL. Institutions and/or publishers who request BHL services or require technical assistance may be required to sign either an MOU or customized agreement that defines their level of participation and may incur service fees.
