Introduction

In the framework of preserving biodiversity literature and integrating it with EOL the BA pursues its efforts in Mirroring Biodiversity Heritage Library and contributing to the literature component of EOL. The material is being availed through two channels;

➤ Mirroring the content of BHL on dar.bibalex.org

The BHL book collection is mirrored and availed publicly online currently reaching 64,038 books fully available and accessed through http://dar.bibalex.org . The remaining books are on the BA's Online Archive going through the pipeline from processing to publishing.

> Building the Regional-BHL website

The milestones for building the Regional BHL website are demonstrated in the table below;

BHL Egypt version I

The system is currently up and running. It is available online on http://bhl.bibalex.org . The previous report includes an elaboration on the system functionalities and features.

BHL Egypt version II




Figure 1 BHL-Egypt design on Desktop




Figure 2 BHL-Egypt design on Mobile

Version II includes several more advanced features and functionalities that are more advanced than Version I. It has been implemented using Ruby-on-Rails programing framework, targeting to yield a more flexible and responsive design which can fit into several environments (desktop, mobiles and tablets)- See Figures 1 & 2 . The design allows for more resilient user interactivity as well as adding more features.

Main features of BHL-Egypt Version II

Homepage




Figure 3 BHL-Egypt Homepage

The new layout of the homepage allows fast access to all website content. In the navigation menu, there are links to "About BHL", browse all Books, Subjects or Authors. Furthermore, the bar holds links to Tree of Life page, Collections and a "Geographic's" page mapping all the books to their publishing place. The homepage contains a list of the top collections, most viewed and top rated books. The right panel holds a list of the most recent activities done by BHL users. (See figure 3)

Book Details




Figure 4 BHL-Egypt website - Book Details Page

The page displays information on the book; book image, title, language, etc. It allows registered users to rate the book or add it to one of their collections, or write their own reviews on the book and see other users' posts. Additionally, the page also displays related books and relevant collections. (See figure 4)

Personalization Component




Figure 5 BHL-Egypt Personalization Features

This component carries all the information about users (personal info, photo, book annotations, saved queries, activities and collections). The navigation pane on the right hand side gives access to those functionalities. (See figure 5)

Internationalization

The new website is an internationalized platform, i.e. it accommodates several languages and allows for seamless switching between different languages as desired. So far, the website is available in two languages; English and Arabic. (See figure 6)

Collections




Figure 7 BHL-Egypt -- Managing Collections

Version II allows users to create and manage different collections. Once the BHL user is a registered member, he/she can create and own a group of collections, each of which can carry multiple books as per the user's selection. A user also has the option to make the collection either publicly accessible (which will appear to all other users to view the collection info and the list of inside books) or private (accessible only to him/her). A user can also add/remove/organize any of the books inside the collection and edit or delete the whole collection. (See figure 7)

Activities




Figure 8 BHL-Egypt-- Activity log filtration




Figure 9 BHL-Egypt-- Activity log

All user activities are logged and users can view all of them listed in a chronological order and filtered by the type of activity (Book Comment, Book Rating, Collection Comment, Collection Rating, Add/Remove Items in Collection ... etc). Users may also view activity logs of other users. (See figure 8 & 9)

Rating




Figure 10 BHL-Egypt-- Average Rating




Figure 11 BHL-Egypt--Content Rating

Users have the option to rate any book/collection. The average rate can be viewed and it is calculated with an average formula that has been implemented in the system. (See figure 10 & 11)

Commenting




Figure 12 BHL-Egypt-- Submitting Comments




Figure 13 BHL-Egypt -- Reporting inappropriate comments

Users may comment on BHL books and collections, where comments may be edited/removed by their submitters. Moreover, inappropriate comments may be reported and when a certain number of reports are received, the comment is removed from the website. (See figure 12 & 13)
