Dear Richard,

Thank you for your patience as the BHL Collections Committee weighed in on the inclusion of the Grammatical Dictionary. The decision at this time is that BHL will not be able to accommodate the Dictionary's inclusion. Our model is based around the digitization of physical volumes and while we are starting to add born-digital content, such as PDFs, we have not yet added website resources to our collection. We are concerned that if we employ a work-around to bring in the Dictionary that we are not providing the optimal display and indexing of this resources to our users.

However, your request has prompted BHL to consider a systematic approach to incorporating web resources and other datasets that complement our collection. As we discuss priorities for future collection and technical development the Grammatical Dictionary use case will be a prominent factor. I regret that we could not move forward at this time but I will do my best to keep you posted as we make progress toward integrating web resources down the road.

The Grammatical Dictionary is not intended to be downloaded or consulted as a reference as are other publications in BHL. Instead it is intended as a handy tool to help understand those books that are written in Latin.

The Dictionary is presented simply as a link in Tropicos

http://www.tropicos.org/click "Tools"

and in Botanicus

http://www.botanicus.org/browse/titles see the upper left of the screen for the link.

It is indeed a searchable database, and is being added to constantly by Patricia Eckel. The unpublished draft is a Word file of over 500 pages and items are added to the online database from this draft as they are vetted and fully documented with quotations and their translations from the literature.

One of the excellent features of the several active online repositories of older literature is a revival of the relevance of that literature to the biodiversity concerns of today. Latin is germane as a past lingua franca.

However, I see a potential issue with the Dictinary's format. BHL focuses on the digitization of physical books. Is Eckel's Dictionary published in hard copy? If not we may be able to work with a PDF.
