TECH HIGHLIGHTS

- Implemented some minor web accessibility enhancements
- · Added a link to the BHL Store to the site header
- Updated the BioStor harvesting process to read an additional contributor field from the BioStor APIs. This allows BHL to recognize two contributors for an article: 1) the contributor that facilitated the ingest of metadata into BHL (i.e. BioStor), and 2) the institution that actually compiled the metadata.
- Updated the contributor browse pages to show institutions in the "contributor" and "rights holder" roles, but not those in the "scanning institution" role.

Content Highlights

In December, we implemented a "BHL Store" button in the header of the BHL website, and we launched a <u>Holiday Collection</u> on the <u>BHL store</u>, featuring holiday themed products. December was our top-grossing month on the BHL store to date, with \$826.53 in sales, which represents \$210.52 in profit for BHL. Since the launch of the store in April 2016, we've sold \$2,416.51, amounting to a profit of \$573.15 for BHL.

The EABL team's work on article definition led to the discovery of a significant article harvesting problem with Pensoft publications. The problem was reported to Pensoft who will provide a fix.

The EABL Collection in BHL currently holds 3530 volumes from 382 titles, containing 384474 pages.

"Packets" or toolkits have been distributed to those who were interested in participating in the project.

Many institutions are preparing to send content to be scanned after the first of the new year.
