### **Specifications for Citebank contributors**

#### Introduction

This document provides a minimum specification for the supply of content files and metadata to Citebank.

To submit citations for inclusion in Citebank, read this document, and then contact Trish Rose-Sandler, <u>trish.rose-sandler@mobot.org</u> Data Analyst, Biodiversity Heritage Library (BHL).

# **Content File Requirements**

We accept any file that represents a simple, self-contained digital object (i.e. comprised of a single content file that does not need to be viewed within page turning software and can be displayed in any online browser). Examples would include PDFs or Word documents.

# **Metadata Requirements**

In order for content to be indexed and made searchable, we also need descriptive information about the content, or metadata (e.g. title, author, date, etc). Metadata is the equivalent of the citation for the content. What type of metadata is needed depends on the publication type of the citation (e.g. an article, book, conference paper, thesis). Publication types in Citebank are defined below along with their required and optional fields. Note: If you have content that does not fit into the publication types articulated below please contact the Collections Coordinator, Bianca Crowley (crowleyb@si.edu) for further discussion.

### **Filenames**

In order to match the citation information to the correct content file, the metadata records must include the name of the file with which it is affiliated (e.g. Smith123.pdf). This information is required before we can incorporate the content into CiteBank.

# Data value guidelines for specific fields

Certain fields will benefit from having their data values submitted in standard forms as it will make the records more interoperable with other records in Citebank, and ultimately improve search results for end users. For example, entering the author's name as LastName, FirstName will allow it to properly sort in the Author Browse along with the other citation records within Citebank. We recommend data value standards for the following fields:

#### Author (s)

Enter value as LastName, FirstName (e.g. Smith, Leonard) or LastName, FirstNameInitials (e.g. Grupta, BJ) Mutiple authors should be clearly separated either in separate cells of a spreadsheet

Or, if all author values are within a single cell, submit them with consistent punctuation between each author so they are easily parseable into separate fields.

#### **Dates**

Enter a single date into the Year of Publication field in the form of YYYY. Date ranges, approximate dates, and more specific dates (e.g. 1912-1932; circa 1932; 2002/11/1) can be entered into the Date Published field. Year of Publication will be used for browsing by year.

# **Publication Type**

If all the records that will be submitted are the same publication type (e.g. Journal Articles, Book Chapters) then that information does not need to be submitted as a separate field within each record but can be communicated to BHL and we will automatically add the information upon ingest of your records. If the submitted records contain a mix of publication types (e.g. Book, Journal Article, Government Report) then the Publication Type must be included within each citation record that is submitted.

### Delivery options for citations and content files

The preferred delivery method for citations and their related content files is either via external hard drives or ftp. Multiple DVDs, if properly labeled, are an acceptable alternative. For external hard drives, it is the responsibility of the contributor to ship the drive to BHL, but BHL will pay to return the drive. Though BHL will take care of the drives, it does not take responsibility for the handling in the mail.

Deposit files in /incoming/BHL

Notify BHL you have deposited the files. (For security purposes the ftp site is cleaned off every 5 days. Contact Trish Rose-Sandler, <u>trish.rose-sandler@mobot.org</u> as soon as files are deposited so that they can be moved to a more permanent location).
